
Welcome to Our Page!

We have lots of exciting learning ahead of us this year. During the **autumn term our topic is The Tudors 'Tales from a Tudor Garden'** – with a focus on how it

was a time of great change for England. This period of history is interesting, and I cannot wait to immerse you in lots of fun activities! This is a topic with History at its heart but we will be linking RE, English and Art into our journey of learning too! We will begin our topic by constructing a timeline to understand the key events that led to the War of the Roses and consequently events during the Tudor period. Furthering this, we will be investigating Henry VIII's personal, religious, and political relationships – especially why he split from Rome and how this affected people at this time. Henry VIII is renowned for his six wives so



we will be looking at each of them in turn as well as some of the many scandals attached to them. We will delve into Elizabeth I's reign and explore the reasons that she did not marry. To end our autumn topic, we will investigate why and how the Tudor period ended by constructing family trees and explaining the introduction of the Union Jack. Our study text this term will be Macbeth, we will be investigating and examining closely the themes, characters, and plot twists within this play. We will become confident in using VIPERS to answer questions about this book. As well as this, we will be enjoying Shakespeare's fantastic imagination and enjoying the spookiness of the Weird Sisters as it gets closer to Halloween and as the dark nights arrive!

As we move onto the spring term, will see us exploring 'The New World', especially looking at North America and the geography of the land from



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east coast to west coast, but also the change of climate and how that has affected people now. We will be following the journey of first people who settled into the 'New World.' After February half term, we will be transitioning into our final topic of the term 'Vive la France'. We will be looking at French history and geography.







Our final term in summer, we will be immersing ourselves into the Victorian Era in the topic 'Children on the Revolution'. This brings us right back into our locality as we explore how Scunthorpe has changed since Victorian times! We will be using census records and old maps to delve into our past and compare how life was for children

then to now. You won't believe how much things have changed!

As Scientists this autumn term, we have two Biology based subjects. We will be continuing to delve deeper into Evolution and Inheritance, investigating patterns in inheritance and variation. We will also be looking closely at how animals adapt to their environment. A key Scientist for this topic is Charles Darwin, in which we will be looking at the importance of his role in science. Following this, Class 6H will be looking at how we can classify living things by exploring Carolus Linnaeus and his classification system. As we move into spring, we will be looking at the human anatomy, changes as we get older and human nutrition. We will transition into Physics, experimenting with light and sight – understanding the process of how we see, shadows, colours, and refraction. For our final term, we will become electricians looking at both simple and parallel circuits and how to draw them using different symbols.
