Social Media and Internet Safety

This half term we have had an increasing number of issues with children accessing a range of social media platforms at home, including: Twitter, Snap Chat, Tik Tok, WhatsApp, etc. Some of these issues have been brought into school and caused a great deal of upset for those children and families involved. They also take up a lot of staff time to offer support, advice and opportunities to resolve these issues.

In response to this, all classes have had additional sessions this half term about Young People's Rights about Social Media and many have been shocked about what they found out. PCSO Tara Empringham has also offered to come into school after Easter to lead a whole school assembly to raise the children's awareness of safety.

Having spoken to a number of parents about these issues, many have spoken about the parental controls they have on their child's devices (tablets, laptops, mobile phones, etc) and how regularly they check what their child is accessing. Please help your child create healthy digital habits. There are apps, such as 'Family Link', that can help parents set digital ground rules to help guide children as they learn, play and explore online through setting screen time limits, approve or block apps, etc.

Can I please remind you that **mobile phones must not be brought into school**, except in exceptional circumstance and with the agreement of Miss Thomas.

Protection from the Sun

It seems that summer is fast approaching!

Can I please ask that children bring a **sunhat/cap** to school with their name in on warmer days. No sun glasses, please.

Water will be provided throughout the day within the classrooms to ensure the children do not become dehydrated, so no water bottles should be brought into school, thank you.

Sun cream/screen should be applied to your child <u>before</u> <u>school at home.</u> There are many brands now that provide at least 12 hours of protection from the sun and are relatively inexpensive so no sun cream needs to be brought into school.

Leys Farm is fortunate to have plenty of areas of natural shade and we will make use of these areas on hotter days.

School uniform must be worn each day except on PE days.

Summer uniform includes;

- girls blue and white gingham summer dresses to be worn with white socks and not tights, please.
- boys can wear grey or black tailored shorts, if you wish. **Please label all uniform**. This makes it much easier for it to be returned to its owner when found.

On PE days children should come in their outdoor PE kit which should include jogging bottoms or leggings, white T-shirt, dark coloured hoodie or jumper and trainers. These should not include fashion or designer logos but could include school jumpers. Shorts can be worn on warmer days or worn underneath jogging bottoms.

No extreme hairstyles or nail polish, either, please.
